Climate change

Our Atmosphere...

- Semi-permeable membrane
- Creates our atmosphere
- Greenhouse gases : CO2, Methane, Nitris Oxide, O3 Water vapor
- CO2 and methane are the most abundant
- Ensures= livable planet
 - Stable temperatures
 - Guards against solar radiation
 - Drives our weather patterns



Climate Change

CO2 and methane are released

into our atmosphere on a regular basis by nature and human actions respiration

- Decomposition/fermentation
- Volcanoes
- Burning fossil fuels/wood
- Livestock= cattle, goats sheep
 - Ruminants release methane
 - Largest source of methane









Sequestering (storing) CO2




CO2 Sequestering (storage): PLANTS

- Forests- Photosynthesisconversion to sugar
- Wetlands
- Organic soil microorganisms
 10 billion bacterial cells / gram of soil
- Oceans kelp & plankton
- Tundra permafrost

 - thawing of soil in arctic



A build up of green house gases in the atmosphere:

- Creates an impermeable membrane
- Retains heat, solar radiation
- Feedback loop accelerating the affects

Environmental effects of Climate Change



• Average global temperature increaserecords broken 7 years in a row


ex. Increase in parasitic events- bark beetle & tick populations

- Sea levels rising 1 4 feet land locked glacial ice melting ex. Florida, Marshall Islands, Antarctica, Arctic
- Changes in weather patterns instability
- Acidity of Oceans- coral bleaching- resulting from increase of Co2 ex. 50% of the Great Barrier Reef in Australia has been destroyed
- Desertification/ flooding/wildfires- loss of habitat & conflict over water and land

Climate Change

Global issue that is everyone's business

- 280ppm = Pre-industrial levels
- 350 ppm = limit to avoid disaster
- 410.82 ppm = June. 2018 CO2 levels
 - hasn't been that level for 20 million years.
- Developed countries , USA and Europe have contributed the most to CO2 emissions for the longest time.
- Undeveloped countries contribute the least but are suffering the most from the effects.




Culture of climate change denial

- **1900** earliest understanding of climate change.
- 1977 Exxon scientists warn to CEO's of effects of climate change and human caused
- Exxon other corp. respond with denial campaign
- 1988 Jim Hansen scientist for NASA
 1st to bring issue to public attention
- 2014 Exxon outed for suppression of facts
- Charges filed for racketeering

 - Setting goals to curb CO2 emissions and the time frame in which to do it.
 - Providing \$ for mitigation and infrastructure repairs in developing countries. How are we going to pay for adapting to rise in sea levels?

Major Climate Summits

- 1997 COP3 Kyoto Protocol -in Kyoto, Japan- Bill Clinton
 - 1st real agreement with majority of countries signing.
 - To be renegotiated in 20 years
- 2015 COP21 in Paris,
 France Barrack Obama
 Set goals for the next 50 years






Out come of the COP21 agreement

- Is not a binding agreement
 - Doesn't hold countries accountable for not meeting the agreement conditions
- Sets goal temperature rise at 2 degrees
 - Doesn't protect the rights of 3rd world countries the their impacts in the coming years.
- Time frame is too long -
- Business as usual
- BUT it is a starting point it's up to the people to hold their governments accountable.

All 199 member countries had signed the agreement except Nicaragua and Saudi Arabia




